Attendance & Punctuality

So far...

- Largely positive
- Some students with outstanding notes to be completed on Compass.
- Lates- Much improved but some students have room for further improvement.
- Reminder- We are obliged to report absences over 20 days to Tusla. You will receive a letter via Compass once your child has gone over 10 days, at 20 days and so on.
- ► There is a direct link between academic success and positive attendance / punctuality





What you can do...

- ► Encourage your child to come to school every day at 8.30 before assembly begins at 8.40am to organise their books
- ► Ensure your child is the correct uniform and has their materials for school e.g. books, ingredients, lunch etc.
- ▶ Where possible <u>organise</u> appointments outside of school
- ▶ Contact the school via Compass to report absences.
- ► Monitor the Dialann closely for positive/poor behaviours and a record of Student Progress
- ► Check-in with your child about their homework and revision

New Leaving Cert Subject Pilot 2025-2026

Welcome to Leaving Certificate Drama, Film, and Theatre Studies (DFTS)!

Following an application process with the Department of Education, the school is delighted and proud to have selected as one of the pilot schools for this new Leaving Cert subject beginning in September 2025.

- This exciting course invites students to dive into the world of drama, film, and theatre where they'll get hands-on experience in creative projects, develop critical skills, and explore a variety of art forms.
- No prior experience in Theatre, Film or Drama is necessary.
- The course takes a multimodal approach, with equal time will be spent on the various aspects of the specification.

Are you interested in any or all of the following areas:

- Drama
- Film Studies
- Drama &/or Film Production
- Performance
- Creative Writing

Why Choose Drama, Film, and Theatre Studies?

DFTS is not only for aspiring actors!!!

It's also for aspiring writers, producers, directors, lighting and sound technicians...



Assessment & Reflection

• The course is designed to make sure students understand the full creative process, from brainstorming ideas to the final performance. To help measure their progress, students will keep a **portfolio** with notes, sketches, and reflections on each project.

• Students' final grade will be split between a written exam in June of 6th Year and a Creativity in Practice Project (ACTs). This project will give them a chance to demonstrate what they've learned by responding creatively.



Applied Creative Tasks (ACTs)

The practical heart of the course, Applied Creative Tasks, involve three major projects over two years. These tasks are designed to let students use everything they're learning in a creative, hands-on way:

Task 1: Creating an Ensemble Theatre Piece Students will work together to create a short theatre piece. They'll get to experience all aspects of theatre production, from acting to designing costumes and sets, and will present this live to an audience.

Task 2: Making a Film Sequence

This task focuses on creating a short film or a sequence of scenes. Students will plan, record, and edit, learning film techniques and how to tell a story on screen

Task 3: Developing a Theatre Piece or Short Film This final task lets students choose to create either a theatre piece or a short film. Inspired by a live performance or film they've seen, Students will work individually or with others to produce a piece that reflects their own artistic vision and knowledge.

Application Process

- As a pilot subject, the number of places available for students will be limited.
- Expression of Interest and Application forms will be made available after the TY Application Process is complete.
- If more students apply than there are places available, students will be selected taking into account their Third Year/TY record.
- NB note that DFTS will not included in the normal subject choice process.

How are we preparing?

Continuous Professional Development for the teachers assigned to the subject is underway.

The Dept has promised that the school will receive subject specific funding and resources (but we're not holding our breath) and we have set assigned a designated teaching space as required.

Students are encouraged to speak with Ms Fox or Mr Davis if they have questions about DFTS before the application process begins.

Bonus 25 points for Leaving Cert Higher Maths Grade H6 and above only

The six highest scores in a single sitting of the examination are then added to give an applicant's total points score.



It's not just about the points!

Other Requirements:

► Individual College "Matriculation"

This refers to the minimum entry requirements for a college. Most colleges require a pass in English or Irish and Mathematics plus 4 other subjects. NUI Colleges have specific requirements requiring English and Irish and a **foreign language** as well as three other subjects.

A foreign language is not required for Science, Nursing, agriculture and Engineering courses. Maynooth University have dropped the language requirement for its Business, Accounting, Finance and Law Courses.



Language Exemption

- ► Where a student is exempt from Irish because of a specific learning difficulty, for example dyslexia, they will also be exempted from the foreign language requirement for NUI Matriculation purpose.
- ► Students must submit evidence of exemption to the NUI. This is a process for this in 6th year.



It's not just about the points!

Other Requirements:

- **▶** Course Subject Requirements
 - Certain courses require a particular grade in a subject: H4 in Honours Irish for Primary School Teaching, H4 Maths for Engineering in TCD
 - ► Chemistry is required for some courses for example Veterinary Medicine in UCD (need H5 Chemistry)
 - ► Some colleges require 2 science subjects for some courses, for example Medicine in Trinity College require H3 and H4 in two sciences
 - ► Colleges and courses differ, and entry requirements change over time, so it is essential that you fully research college requirements and career pathways.
- ► And of course there is the..... 'The Points'
 - ► The Maynooth Bachelor of Arts Degree, CAO Code: MH101 CAO points 2023: **310 2024:307**



► It is a distinct, self-contained two-year Leaving Certificate programme aimed at preparing students for adult and working life

► It emphasises forms of achievement and excellence which the established Leaving Certificate has not recognised in the past




